#	WORD	DEFINITION
1	<b>brutally</b>	adv. in a harsh and violent way.   <i>"The young groom brutally jerked the reins, not understanding that pain makes a frightened horse more difficult, not less."</i>
1	<b>compassionate</b>	adj. showing sympathy and concern for others.   <i>"Squire Gordon was compassionate toward every horse in his stable, checking each one personally before retiring."</i>
1	<b>deteriorate</b>	v. to become worse over time or quality.   <i>"Under Skinner's ownership Beauty began to deteriorate visibly, his once-glossy coat growing rough and his eyes losing their light."</i>
1	<b>distressing</b>	adj. causing anxiety or sorrow.   <i>"It was deeply distressing to Beauty when Ginger was brought in broken and trembling from the bearing rein."</i>
1	<b>grateful</b>	adj. feeling or showing thanks for something.   <i>"Beauty felt deeply grateful whenever a groom spoke quietly and moved slowly, treating him as a feeling creature."</i>
1	<b>merciless</b>	adj. showing no mercy or pity towards others.   <i>"The merciless whip fell again and again, long after any sensible driver would have seen the horse was spent."</i>
1	<b>neglected</b>	adj. not cared for or given attention.   <i>"The horses at Skinner's yard were neglected and hollow-cheeked, their coats dull from poor feed and hard usage."</i>
1	<b>obediently</b>	adj. obeying or willing to obey; complying with or submissive to authority   <i>"Beauty stood obediently at the mounting block, though he trembled at the unfamiliar smell of the new rider."</i>
1	<b>overloaded</b>	v. to put too heavy or great a load in or on.   <i>"The poor cab horse was grotesquely overloaded, his thin legs trembling under a burden no beast should carry."</i>
1	<b>recuperate</b>	v. to recover or regain health or strength after an illness or injury.   <i>"Given pasture and rest, Beauty began to recuperate slowly, his strength returning with each week of gentle treatment."</i>
1	<b>reliable</b>	adj. able to be trusted or depended on.   <i>"A reliable horse like Beauty was worth more than any flashy animal that shied at every passing shadow."</i>
1	<b>resolutely</b>	adv. in a way that shows determination or firmness.   <i>"John Manly resolutely refused to use the bearing rein, declaring no fashion was worth destroying a good horse's neck."</i>
1	<b>spirited</b>	adj. full of vigor courage or enthusiasm.   <i>"Beauty was spirited but never vicious, responding to a kind hand with more willingness than spurs ever produced."</i>
1	<b>steadfastly</b>	adv. in a way that shows loyalty and determination.   <i>"Ginger steadfastly refused the bearing rein, throwing her head against it until her neck ran with sweat."</i>
1	<b>tenderly</b>	adv. in a gentle and caring way.   <i>"Joe Green tended the exhausted horse tenderly through the night, never leaving his side until the fever broke."</i>
