#	WORD	DEFINITION
1	laboriously	adv. in a way that requires a lot of effort.   "He laboriously hollowed a canoe from a great cedar trunk, only to find he could not drag it to sea."
1	apprehensive	adj. feeling anxious about something that may happen.   "Crusoe grew deeply apprehensive after discovering the footprint, and doubled the height of his outer stockade that night."
1	deliberate	adj. done on purpose and with careful thought.   "Every action Crusoe took was deliberate and measured, for a single miscalculation could cost him everything he had built."
1	desolate	adj. feeling sad and lonely or deserted.   "The desolate coastline offered no sign of passing ships, and the silence pressed in on him like a weight."
1	fortify	v. to make stronger or more secure.   "His first priority was to fortify his shelter against both the elements and any savages who might land."
1	improvise	v. to create or perform without preparation.   "Without a kiln he had to improvise, drying his earthen pots slowly under the fierce equatorial sun."
1	industrious	adj. hardworking and diligent in tasks.   "By nature industrious, he could not remain idle; even in despair his hands sought timber, clay, or grain."
1	methodically	adv. in an orderly and systematic way.   "He methodically catalogued every item rescued from the wreck, rationing supplies against an unknown length of exile."
1	persevering	v. to continue despite difficulties or opposition or discouragement; adj. continuing despite difficulties opposition or discouragement   "Crusoe was nothing if not persevering; he rebuilt his canoe three times before it finally held the water."
1	providential	adj. happening by good fortune or chance.   "He regarded the sprouting barley as providential, a sign that heaven had not entirely forsaken his small patch."
1	resourceful	adj. able to find quick and clever ways to do things.   "Crusoe proved remarkably resourceful, fashioning tools from salvaged timber long before his first harvest came in."
1	salvageable	adj. able to be saved or recovered.   "He waded back to the wreck repeatedly, determined to retrieve every salvageable plank before the tide turned against him."
1	self-sufficient	adj. able to provide for oneself without help.   "After five years he had become entirely self-sufficient, growing grain, raising goats, and curing his own provisions."
1	solitary	adj. being alone or without companions.   "The solitary years wore upon his spirit, yet Crusoe filled each day with labour to keep despair at bay."
1	tenaciously	adv. In a manner that is very determined to do something and not easily discouraged.   "He tenaciously maintained his calendar, cutting notches into the post lest he lose all reckoning of the days."
