Definition

n. A literary device in which the actual outcome is different from what was expected, often highlighting a contrast between human intentions and actual results.

Example Sentence

The **situational irony** was evident when the fire station burned down.

In a twist of **situational irony**, the professional swimmer drowned in a shallow pool.
